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A LETTER FROM OUR FOUNDERS

2022 has been an exciting year for Vitala Global – we launched our digital abortion companion, Aya Contigo, in Venezuela, shared our work at several meetings and conferences, secured funding to continue to deepen our impact in Venezuela and beyond, built trusted partnerships, and we were recognized by Forbes and WHO-IBP Network for our leadership and innovation.

We co-founded Vitala Global from our shared experiences working in some of the most challenging contexts in the world. As we reflect on the work we have accomplished since founding Vitala Global in 2020, we see that our impact is through our process of rigorous evidence-based research methodologies that center the needs of our end-users and their communities, ensuring trust-based partnerships and collaborations, and infusing our work with empathy and deep humility. We started our journey with openness and curiosity, applying our combined clinical and global experiences to co-create with Venezuelans an evidence based digital solution to support self-managed abortion in their country where they face a complex humanitarian crisis and restrictive laws impacting reproductive rights. Launching Aya Contigo in Venezuela on March 10, 2022, has been a highlight. Aya is demonstrating that not only can a digital platform facilitate access and support for self-managed abortion, it can improve the quality of the experience for the person seeking an abortion, and empower people to have autonomy over their reproductive choices.

What we are building goes beyond just a digital app - it is also about building and fostering trusted partnerships and integrating our work within the local ecosystem. We have become a bridge between the formal health system and the grassroots feminist community. And our impact is further amplified through these mission-aligned collaborations and partnerships. All of this would not be possible without our amazing multidisciplinary team of passionate, mission-driven, and talented young people!

In 2022 we saw some historical wins in the reproductive rights movement in Latin America from Colombia to Mexico. This same year the world witnessed the Dobbs decision and the fall of Roe V. Wade, compromising many people's reproductive rights and autonomy in the US. As a global, mission-driven organization committed to elevating the most underserved, we believe that now more than ever we need to collaborate in innovative ways, such as creating private-public partnerships, staying authentic and true to person-centered care, and being mindful of this deeply connected global issue restricting reproductive autonomy. This is the way forward to ensure that individuals can trust that they will receive the quality abortion care that they deserve – non-judgemental, empathetic and meeting them where they are.

Throughout this report, we highlight our impact since founding in 2020, with an emphasis on 2022. We are excited for the ongoing expansion and scale of our efforts in Latin America and the United States. We are humbled, honored and grateful to be able to make an impact in the lives of women and girls living in the most challenging circumstances globally. Thank you for coming along and supporting us on this journey.

A Global Problem

Globally, sexual and reproductive health disparities persist due to ongoing restrictions on reproductive autonomy. Women and girls* are suffering from or dying of unsafe abortions, which are entirely preventable. 32 million unsafe abortions occur every year and 7 million women and girls* are injured, disabled or die from complications. About 97% of all unsafe abortions and related deaths occur in developing countries in Africa, Latin America and Asia.

OUR FOOTPRINT



Canada

Vitala Global's inception was in Canada, where Roopan and Genevieve are both OBGYNs. This is where we launched our first product, myPostCare, and have key partnerships in pregnancy loss and early miscarriage.

United States

We are engaging with organizations within the abortion & reproductive justice space to understand how Aya Contigo can support the Latina/x community. We are doing user-testing to adapt Aya for the US context and address the needs of the Latina/x community. We are assessing the complex legal and cybersecurity risks of offering our solution in the US.

Mexico

We are partnering with feminist groups and SRH organizations across the country to understand the role Aya Contigo plays within this ecosystem, and how Aya Contigo can reach migrants, refugees, and those in more restrictive states.

Venezuela

We co-designed and launched Aya Contigo in Venezuela - a humanitarian setting. Aya is demonstrating that a virtual abortion accompaniment model is a safe, acceptable and feasible digital solution in the safe abortion ecosystem to support women's quality of care through a self-managed medication abortion.

Colombia

We worked together with Profamilia - a private non-profit organization that guarantees sexual and reproductive rights in Colombia - in the human-centered research and design of adapting their teleabortion service to improve abortion self-care support for youth.

Our Process

Inclusive human-centered research, design thinking, community engagement, and multidisciplinary collaboration is central to Vitala Global’s processes, and reflected in the development and implementation of our main product - Aya Contigo, a digital abortion companion.

In order for our digital tools to be meaningful and impactful, we believe in spending time with our intended users and their communities to hear the gaps they identify in accessing safe, up-to-date, and reliable sexual and reproductive health care and services. This approach has allowed for trust-building in forming key partnerships and collaborations to extend our reach and impact with our products. From the research that informs the design and implementation of our products to consulting projects with partners in Latin America, we bring our expertise to collaboration, research methods and user experience to create features and solutions that best align to our users’ lived experiences.

Thanks to the support of a Grand Challenges Canada OPTions grant received in 2019, we conducted a three-phase study in 2020 to collect input from local grassroots organizations and women in Venezuela. Through this, we found that 1 in 4 of the respondents had undergone an abortion in their lifetime, and that among those who had not, 1 in 3 knew someone who had. It also revealed that, as misinformation about abortion is rampant in the country, there is a pressing need for reliable information about abortion, and that a common way to attempt to access such information is to use WhatsApp groups, Facebook, Instagram, and Google searches on mobile phones.

Women expressed a need for a trustworthy tool that – in one single place – would provide all the evidence-based information they may need before, during and after an abortion. Women also expressed a need for emotional support and accompaniment during the abortion process. We found that psychoemotional support and the integration of self-care as a continuum of care - virtually or in person - is consistently neglected.

Our community-led, localized approach and the belief that we must co-develop and implement digital solutions with people experiencing the pain points, led to creation of Aya Contigo, a digital abortion companion that provides end-to-end support through their self-managed abortion and contraception decision-making journey.

AYA CONTIGO IMPACT

Our team has expertise on how to equitably center the needs of those needing an abortion by engaging with the most vulnerable communities, which are disproportionately impacted by legal restrictions and access barriers. We learned that while it's important to consider quantitative impact measures of the app, it is equally important for the community and local stakeholders to define what impact means to them. This is why we are committed to also understanding the qualitative impacts of our work through user-feedback and storytelling, and meaningful engagements with our community partners.

From our Aya Contigo users:

“Aya was like that wise best friend who calms you down, supports you and makes you feel safe, that everything will be fine. By far it is the best application I have installed.

“Thank goodness that I turned to PLAFAM, because if I hadn't, I would not have known about Aya Contigo. And if it weren't for Aya Contigo, I wouldn't have had safe information about abortions.

“Following the steps indicated by the companion is the main thing. Thanks to following these instructions, the process was not so painful....

“Really I am very grateful for the accompaniment in my process. Despite my fear and perhaps my lack of understanding, this team knew how to guide me so that I would not be alone and be able to live the process as least traumatic as possible.

In a time of fear and uncertainty, Aya Contigo is empathy, comfort, safety, prevention, confidentiality, and sisterhood.

HIGHLIGHT: VENEZUELA



Building trust and relationships within the Venezuelan sexual and reproductive health and rights community

We have spent the past 3 years listening to the SRHR community in Venezuela, building and fostering trusted partnerships and integrating our work within the local ecosystem, and the regional network of feminist abortion groups. We are grateful for their trust and shared values of providing quality abortion care and support regardless of the context. We are committed to supporting our local partners through capacity building workshops, subgrants, and connecting them with our network of mission-aligned partners and supporters.

Scaling to Venezuelan Youth



With the GCC OPTions transition-to-scale grant, we are scaling our work to youth in Venezuela to ensure that their needs are reflected in our work. We have a Youth Advisory Board that advises on our social media and outreach strategies, adapting research protocols and our values clarifications workshops. We completed a social media survey and a qualitative Photovoice project to assess the SRH needs and perceptions of Venezuelan youth ages 10-19. The main takeaways were the need for safe spaces to express creativity through art-based interventions and to integrate mental health care with sexual & reproductive health care and services.

Safeguarding with Women's Link Worldwide



The Women's Link team has supported us in developing a contextual legal risk analysis of our Aya Contigo work, and recommending safeguarding policies for our users, team and partners in Venezuela. They supported us in a legal workshop with Venezuelan lawyers to co-create and inform the analysis. We are implementing them with the support of legal allies they have connected us with on the ground.


MSF LATAM Partnership Opportunity



MSF plays a crucial role in supporting the most vulnerable and marginalized communities globally by providing medical assistance to people affected by conflict, epidemics, disasters, or exclusion from healthcare. We are exploring partnership opportunities with MSF to address SRHR inequities across Latin America.

HIGHLIGHTS



Adaptation of a teleabortion platform to improve abortion self-care and support in Colombia.

Mia is a teleabortion service by Profamilia, a private non-profit that promotes and defends SRHR in Colombia. Vitala has collaborated with Profamilia to co-create a comprehensive digital web-app that integrates SRH self-care with their abortion telemedicine services as well as their GBV and contraception services, with a focus on reaching hard-to-reach groups in Colombia (youth and refugees/migrants). The prototype is now in development.



IMAP Statement on Digital Health Interventions for SRHR

Vitala collaborated with International Planned Parenthood (IPPF), their member associations and partners to co-create an [International Medical Advisory Panel \(IMAP\) Statement on Digital Health Interventions \(DHIs\) for SRHR](#). The statement highlights how DHIs can bridge gaps between formal and community-based models of SRH service delivery and offer unique benefits such as accessibility, privacy, anonymity, linkages to the health system and opportunities for continuous programme monitoring and evaluation. It was released in September 2022 and was launched during Digital Health Week 2022 on October 13.



Early Pregnancy Loss: Human-centered research and design

Approximately 1 in 4 women experience a miscarriage in their lifetime. Unfortunately, many individuals do not receive the level of care or support they need following a miscarriage. With the support from the BC Women's Health Foundation, we conducted human-centered research and stakeholder engagement to co-create a digital tool to better support people experiencing miscarriage.

Global allies



PLAFAM is the main provider of SRH services in Venezuela and supported us in the co-design, development and implementation of Aya Contigo as a harm reduction safe abortion tool. They are key partners in our referral network for our users who want/need complementary SRH services (contraception, GBV, sexual health, and post-abortion care). They are a trusted SRH service provider in Venezuela and we were able to leverage their Facebook and Instagram accounts to conduct our human-centered research remotely during the COVID19 pandemic. They cannot provide abortion care given the restrictions in Venezuela, but they are committed to providing harm reduction counselling and refer people to Aya Contigo for further guidance and support.

Feminist 'acompañantes'

Acompañantes are women who accompany and support people through their medication abortions. Feminist abortion accompaniment is a model of abortion care in Latin America and a movement that supports people in accessing safe abortion and exercising their reproductive autonomy regardless of the legal context. It is activist-driven and use community-based strategies to facilitate use of de-medicalized approaches to widely available medications. There is a shared understanding of self-managed abortion as being evidence-based, but also a practice that is caring, autonomous, and free of violence, stigma, and judgment. **Aya Contigo models this approach through virtual accompaniment. Local acompañantes** are key partners for our work in **facilitating access and providing in-person accompaniment** for women who use Aya Contigo.



To reach other underserved populations, we have partnered with grassroots organizations that work with youth, LGBTQ, gender-based violence, rural communities, and humanitarian aid.




