Canada

Our headquarters are in Canada where co-founders Dr. Roopan Gill and Dr. Genevieve Tam met .

Venezuela

Vitala's core country where we co-designed, created and implemented our flagship product, Aya Contigo. We launched it in March 2022.

United States

The first country outside LATAM where we launched Aya Contigo. We adapted and launched it in partnership with Planned Parenthood Federation of America for Latina/xs and Hispanics. This was the first country where we tried our Aya-as-a-service model.

Guatemala

In 2023, we secured funding to scale into Guatemala. This is the second country in Latin America where Aya Contigo will be available. Our estimated timeline for launch is January 2025.

COUNTRY HIGHLIGHT

Our US Launch: Building on Lessons from the Global South to Support Underserved Communities in post-Roe US

Abortion bans threaten 6.7 million Latinas/xs, the largest group of women of color living under bans in the U.S. A majority of these Latinas/xs lives in three states that have restrictive laws – Florida, Texas, and Arizona.

More than 1 million Latinas/xs in these states report not speaking English or not speaking it well, a substantial barrier to accessing and receiving culturally competent care.



USER TESTING

We tested Aya Contigo with 42+ Latina/xs across the U.S. We learned that Aya's holistic model of care is wanted and needed to support the Latina/x community impacted by the bans.

End-to-end support for self-managed abortion care

Aya Contigo is a safe end-to-end medical abortion digital companion that guides, supports, and connects users providing timely, comprehensive care with trustworthy information on self-managed abortion (SMA), contraception methods and miscarriage, referrals within a network of service providers, and real-time technical and psychoemotional support.

Our approach to care goes beyond guiding with scientific medical information. It encompasses psychoemotional, social support, and counseling to address the holistic well-being of our users. We promote self-care in every stage of the abortion journey, empowering individuals to actively manage their health and make informed decisions about their well-being.







Holistic Care

Strengthened by a trusted referral network

Our Care Team refers users to trusted local partners for access to medication, and post-care including contraception, psychological services, and more. When feasible, our Care Team makes referrals during 44% of conversations on average.

In 2023, the Aya Care Team had a total of 456 conversations with users in Venezuela, supporting an average of 22 people per month before, during, and after an abortion, or on other SRH topics such as contraception, sexually transmitted infections, and gender-based violence.



Our innovation team's close collaboration with Vitala is centered in trust-building, shared learning, and human-centered and equity-driven approach to change. By bringing together learnings from Aya Contigo's work in Venezuela with PPFA's research on reproductive health in US Latina/x communities, we were better able to co-create an adapted version for US Spanish and English speakers that meets the emotional challenges that self-managed abortion seekers face, with compassion and accurate information.





Youth Forum

In July of 2023, we launched the Aya Contigo youth forum for users seeking information about abortion and other sexual and reproductive health topics or looking to share their experiences with other users.

PARTNERSHIPS

Venezuela & US Partners



PLAFAM is the main provider of SRH services in Venezuela and continues to be one of our two main partners in our referral network for our users who need SRH services such as contraception, GBV, sexual health, and post-abortion care. Although they do not offer abortion care, they are committed to providing harm reduction counselling and refer people to Aya Contigo for further guidance and support.

Feminist Networks

Local acompañantes are key partners in facilitating access and providing in-person accompaniment for women who use Aya Contigo. Feminist abortion accompaniment is a model of abortion care in Latin America and a movement that supports people in accessing safe abortion and exercising their reproductive autonomy through evidence and community-based strategies regardless of the legal context.

Grassroots Organizations

To reach other underserved populations, we continue to partner with grassroots organizations that work with youth, LGBTQ, gender-based violence, rural communities, and humanitarian aid.

We have partnered with Turimiquire Foundation to better understand the barriers users in rural areas face in accessing comprehensive SRH, and to adapt Aya Contigo to meet their specific needs.

Scaling Our Impact

The first phase of our pilot with Planned Parenthood Federation of America (PPFA) revealed that the Latina/x community in the US has needs similar to those of Venezuelan users.

Stigma, anti-abortion politics, and fear of criminalization force many abortion seekers to navigate in isolation. PPFA and Vitala Global partnered to explore how we can fill gaps in emotional and navigational support for both English- and Spanish-speakers.

We will continue testing Aya Contigo's capabilities with a **broader reach.**




